## Sexual Assault Prevention, Response, & Recovery (SAPRR) Program



- *The mission of the SAPRR program is to counter sexual assault and the damage it causes by providing immediate and compassionate victim support; a responsive and intimidation-free reporting environment; access to a timely, professional investigation; holistic care and recovery for victims; and accountability for those who commit this crime.*

## TWO REPORTING OPTIONS

### *Restricted*

- Confidential
- Official reports can be made to a Sexual Assault Response Coordinator, Victim Advocate, or Medical Officer
- Advocacy, Sexual Assault Forensic Exams (SAFEs) medical, Chaplain, counseling, & Special Victims' Counsel (SVC) services are available without initiating an official investigation
- May participate in the CATCH a Serial Offender database program

### *Unrestricted*

- Not completely confidential—information is shared on a “need to know” basis
- Advocacy, medical, SAFE, Chaplain, counseling, & SVC services are available
- Requires command notification
- Activates a Coast Guard Investigative Services (CGIS) investigation
- Additional tools/policies are available to the command to support the victim/survivor

- Public Health Service Officers detailed to the Coast Guard
- DoD service members assigned to Coast Guard commands
- Adult dependents of an Active Duty Coast Guard member
- Current Coast Guard civilian employee
